



Are you a vendor who is interested in hawking wares at this year's Tabfest? Well here's some info you may find useful. Gates will open at 12noon on Friday—vendors may arrive any time after dawn to set up shop. We will have a designated vending area. Vendors will be placed as they arrive by Tabfest staff.

We will not have electrical hookups, nor water available, however, so please plan accordingly. You will need to purchase tickets to get in the gate, plus there will be a vending fee (see below). You may buy presale tickets here on this website).

Presale Vending Pass (available from now until July 10): \$200.
Days of Show Vending Pass (available from July 11 to DOS): \$250.
ALL Food Vending Passes: \$400.
Walking vending passes: \$35 always*

**Anyone attempting to vend without a vending permit will be asked nicely ONCE to pay the fee or to cease vending. A second time will result in expulsion from Tabfest. NO NEGOTIATIONS. All of the proceeds from Tabfest benefit charities such as Ronald McDonald House Charities--we do not feel bad removing anyone from Tabfest who is attempting to effectively steal from our charities.*

Food Vendors

All vendors must have a vendor pass and ticket for admittance. Simply notify the gate attendants that you are a vendor and they will take care of you. Legal Info

The State of Ohio requires all vendors selling merchandise to pay sales tax and hold either a transient vendor's license from the State of Ohio, or a temporary vending permit from the county in which the sales are made (Mercer County). All vendors are expected to collect and remit Ohio Sales Tax properly, and Tabfest and the Harmony for Ohio Foundation is not liable for this tax compliance. Food vendors will be required to show a permit from the Mercer County Health Department. Vendors must comply with all Health Department requirements.
